

Resources for parents/allies of LGBTQI+ Youth

Our kids present us with challenges and surprises on a daily basis. Maybe you've always suspected or maybe today really threw you for a loop, but your son/daughter just said these 3 words, "Mom/Dad, I'm gay/bisexual/lesbian/ transgender". And you just blanked. That's ok! Parents are supposed to be the "experts" on our kids, but no one gave us a manual that **really** explained what in the world we're supposed to be doing. I can freely admit, sometimes I screw that up and sometimes I don't know the answer and **it's ok!** Below you'll find my go to resources on learning more about the LGBTQI+ community; from learning about what all those letters I just said even mean to understanding what it means to be an ally.  - PFLAG is great because they are the largest organization out there representing LGBTQI+ folx. You may feel alone or confused yourself about what to do now that you've heard the 3 little words.
